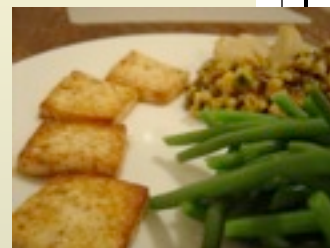
Tofu Squares

1 lb tofu, 1/2 c. chopped onions (optional), 2 c. water, 1 Tbs. chicken-style seasoning, 2 Tbs. Braggs liquid aminos, 1 Tbs. lemon or lime juice, 1 tsp. honey

Preparation:

Slice tofu lengthwise in half, then crosswise in 1/4 in. slices (makes 16). Lay tofu slices flat in 8x11 pan. Cover with onions. Mix other ingredients & pour over tofu. Bake

uncovered at 350 degrees for about 30 minutes.
